We will also be participating in the BC Thanksgiving Food Drive to help families in need in our community. The provincial government announced yesterday that **schools will be closed on Monday**, **September 19**, to mark an official day of mourning for Queen Elizabeth II.

Shirt Day on September 28. Students and staff are invited to wear orange shirts in place of their usual uniform shirts (along with uniform pants/skirts). On September 29<sup>th</sup>, students have no school as staff share a day of learning (Pro-D Day) and schools are also closed September 30<sup>th</sup> to recognize the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

### Noon Hour Supervisors

We are looking for 2-3 casual noon-hour supervisors at Auguston for this year. At this point we are only looking for on call availability though some regular shifts may come available as the year progresses. This is a paid position (\$19/hour) and shifts are between 12:15 and 1:15pm Mondays to Fridays. There are also some spots for after school bus duty available between 2:35 and 3:05pm. ### Parking

Our drop off and pickup times can get quite busy in and around our parking lot and street. Please help us keep the flow of traffic moving by not stopping or parking in traffic/bus loops, by driving around the loop if your child is not ready curbside and by choosing a parking spot during pickup and drop off if possible. I know the congestion can be difficult as we move in and out of the school, but it is usually a fairly quick 10-minute turnaround. Also keep an eye out for kids crossing at the crosswalks and remember that school speed zones of 30km an hour are in effect. Thank you for helping to keep us all safe.

# Dogs and other pets on school grounds

A reminder that dogs and other pets are not permitted on school grounds in accordance with school district policy. There are posted signs on school grounds. This is for safety and health reasons. Pets are allowed for things such as show and tell with prior approval from your child's classroom teacher or principal. We appreciate your cooperation with this policy.

### Bicycles, Scooters, Skateboards, Heelies and Other Wheeled Items

A reminder that these "wheeled" modes of transportation should be walked on and off school grounds for safety reasons. This includes the front of school sidewalk. With many younger students and pre-school children walking or running about an unfortunate accident could occur. Students riding these wheeled "vehicles" should be wearing a helmet. Please speak to your children regarding this matter.

### Keeping up to date through the Abbotsford School District "APP"

A handy app is available for parents and students in Abbotsford School District: the Abby Schools app is available for downloading on iPhones or Android mobile phones. The app provides the user with announcements, news, events and contact information about any of the district's schools and many district departments. Once downloaded on a phone, a user can choose which school or district department they wish to receive information from. There is an ability to have notifications so parents, students, staff or any user can be aware when new information is posted by the school or district. The mobile app is directly linked to school and district websites, so once content is published to the website it automatically is pushed to the app as well.

The app is easily downloadable to iPhones and Androids. Search on either for "Abby Schools". Users can follow any number of schools, along with district and department information.

### Bringing Electronic Equipment to School

Students at times bring various types of electronic devices to school (handheld gaming device). We would encourage you to ask your children to leave these devices at home. We don't want them to be damaged or misplaced as we cannot be responsible for their safekeeping at school. Thank you for cooperation.

### Administration of Medication at School

If your child is required to take medication at school (i.e. asthma puffers, or prescription medicines) a "Permission to Administer Medication" form must be completed by your family doctor and returned to our office annually. ### Allergy Awareness



Many children come to school with life threatening allergies. This can vary from food allergies to certain foods like

nuts, fish, dairy etc., or it can be allergies associated with bee stings. Children with severe allergies require immediate medical attention should they come into contact with an allergen. Schools often have children with allergies to specific types of nuts such as peanuts and other nut products. For the safety of children, we are asking your cooperation in restricting the use of nut products in lunches or other food items brought to school. We understand that it is difficult at times to know what is in specific food products. For classrooms that have students with severe nut or other type of allergies we ask that parents refrain from sending items with these specific food products. It is understood that assuring that a school is absolutely "nut free" may be difficult and instead ask that our school community be "nut aware" so that we do not become complacent by thinking we are completely "nut free". We thank you for your understanding with this serious matter.

# Lunches, Labels, and other Extras

Families are encouraged to ensure that students have all the materials required for the day of learning (ie. snack lunch, gym strip, jacket, homework, library book, etc.) upon their arrival to school. If you must bring a lunch to the office during the day, please ring the doorbell.

As well, ensure the lunch is clearly labeled with FIRST and LAST names, and your child's division. That helps us ensure your child receives their item in a timely manner. **School Supplies**, **jackets, hats, and sweaters should all be labeled clearly with your child's name as well.** Our Lost and Found overflows very quickly with articles left out on the playground. A name written inside these items allows us to find the owner.

With SafeArrival, you can report your child's absence in advance using any of these 3 convenient methods:

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

<u>Note</u>: Absences of more than 3 days should be reported to <u>auguston@abbyschools.ca</u> or Ph: 604- 557-0422 (there is a 3 days in a row maximum for reporting on School Arrival).

### Early Morning Arrivals to School

Please understand that adult supervision of students does not begin until 8:30 am. As the mornings become darker, we are not aware of students being in and around the school especially if they are on the playground. We understand that as parents work commitments often involve leaving early. If this is the case, we ask if it is possible for your children to go to friend's home and come to school closer to the time when supervision begins. We appreciate your cooperation with this matter. Safety of children is paramount. After school, supervision is from 2:37 to 2:47pm.

Please do not allow students to climb trees, the dug out or other "high up" places before or after school!

### Early Pick Up

If you need to pick up your child due to illness (for an appointment, please enter it in Safe Arrival and let your child's teacher know), please ring the doorbell when you arrive. Your child will need to be signed out.

# Dropping off something for your child

In order to minimize class disruption and to adhere to safety protocols, <u>please do not take</u> <u>items directly to your child's classroom or</u> <u>portable</u>.

Please drop them off at the office and they will be delivered to your child.

### **Daily Health Check**

All parents, guardians, and/or caregivers are encouraged to conduct a **Daily Health Assessment of their child(ren) each day before sending them to school**. Families can use the provincial BC Thrive Assessment. See <u>Latest</u> <u>Updates</u> from the district website.

### Appointments

If at all possible, please try to schedule appointments or activities for your child outside of school hours to



help protect instructional time. If unavoidable, please notify the office beforehand <u>via Safe</u> <u>Arrival</u> and notify your child's teacher.



**Consent forms are ONLINE in SchoolCash**. Consent includes Request for Email Address Consent, Google for Education, Photograph/Video and Media, Permission off Grounds and for Field Trips.

We would like to encourage <u>ALL families</u> at our school to utilize the online option for consent & payments <u>EVERY</u> time! We are currently at <u>91.20</u>% who have signed up. Let's make it 98, 99 or even 100% Auguston and <u>PLEASE USE the online option every time</u>!

Thank you to parents who have set up your schoolcash account and utilize this option. You will be receiving reminders and messages about new items being added to your child's 'cart' when field trips and other items arise. A suggestion is to purchase a **prepaid credit card** to make purchases if you are concerned about online shopping. The district site is a secure site which does not hold account information.

*SchoolCashOnline* limits the amount of cash/cheques handled in schools, reduces paperwork, and results in more focused instructional time in the classroom. The Abbotsford School District now uses SchoolCashOnline for all schools. With SchoolCashOnline, parents have the convenient and secure option of paying for school items using their credit card online, 24/7.
