# Inclement weather guidelines



As we head into our snowy and icy season, please be aware of our <u>winter weather</u> <u>procedures</u> found on the district website.

If schools are closed, emails (and text messages if you have signed up for them) are sent out by the School District office. School closure information will also be posted on our website, on social media and broadcasted by local radio stations. If you wake up to snow, please check there first to see if a snow day has been called.

### Sledding rules



Yes – we do allow students to bring sleds to school, and yes, we have already had some injuries. Our rules around sledding on school grounds are as follows:

- Grade 5's only on the hillside beside the gym and ONLY with helmets on.
- Grades K-5 are able to slide on the hill above our school field – helmets are preferred. The grade 4/5 area is closest to the backstop, with grades 2 and 3 between the trees and K/1s farthest from the school on the smallest slope.
- Only students with sleds are allowed on the hills. As some families will choose not to send their kids with sleds for safety reasons, sharing of sleds is not allowed unless it is between siblings.
- Students are to sled down alone (no doubling up) and one at a time, giving the previous sledder time to move away from the bottom of the hill before going.
- Students at the bottom are to move to the side of the hill to make their way back up.
  By the school field, students are able to move to where they are in line with one of the trees bordering the track and move up to the top safely from there.
- No standing at the bottom of the hill unless you are out of the slide zone.
- It can get icy and slippery out there, so caution while around the sledding areas is important!
- No skis or snowboards please, just sleds.
- There is no sledding allowed on the hillside above our Kindergarten rooms (beside our garden area) during school hours or within the duty times before and after school.
- If conditions become too icy, sledding will be closed. This closure will be decided on depending on conditions on a daily basis.

- Students are also asked not to eat the snow in and around the school pavement areas as we use rock salt and chemical products to reduce the ice and make our surfaces less slippery.
- We also have a no throwing snow rule not at each other, not at trees or buildings, not up in the air as there are rocks and ice chunks mixed in.

### **Christmas Concert**



Classes are busy practicing and recording their Christmas concert performances for you! We are doing everything online this year

and we hope to be able to share our concert file with you in the last week of school before the break (our goal is to release it on December 14<sup>th</sup>). Our online format will allow you to watch the concert when it is convenient for you and your family, watch it many times over if you like, share it with loved ones over the holiday and enjoy it all from the comfort of your own living room – no fighting for front row seats as everyone gets one! We look forward to spreading some joy and Christmas cheer with you!

# Last Day Field Trip Volunteers

What a wonderful way to spend our last day of school together enjoying some fun winter exercise and a warm yummy meal.

There is no cost to students for the field trip if students have their own skates and helmets as our PAC is covering EVERYTHING! (did I say how amazing they are – oh, yes I did! And yes they are!). Both skates and helmets can be rented at MRC and information is available on the permission in <u>School Cash Online</u>. Because this is a school event, **all skaters** are required to wear a helmet on the ice.

Volunteers are needed, both to help us tie skates at MRC and to help prepare and serve our pancake lunch. If you would like to volunteer for skating, please indicate that in schoolcash and your child's teacher will confirm as there is a limit to the number of adults we can fit on the bus. If you are hoping to help out at the school with the lunch, please email Mrs. Sward (Kris.Sward@abbyschools.ca). As this is a school event volunteer packages and Criminal Record Checks must be completed if you are wanting to volunteer.

### Ice Skating - Gr. 1-5

Gr. 1-5 students are going Ice Skating on the last day of school before Christmas break! **Thank you to the PAC** who is sponsoring the bussing and facility costs. There is NO cost to parents for ice skating if your child has skates and a helmet they can bring from home, but we do NEED consent. Please ensure your child is dressed appropriately for skating.

Please complete consent in <u>schoolcash</u> for your child to participate in ice skating.

#### Skating Times (3 busses for each group)

- Gr. 1-3 students in Div. 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 & 13 (Gr. 1s only) will leave Auguston at 10am to travel by school bus to MRC (Matsqui Recreation Centre), skate from 10:45 to 11:30am, then return to Auguston by 12:15pm.
- Gr. 3-5 students in Div. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 6 will leave Auguston at 10:55am to travel by school bus to MRC, skate from 11:30 to 12:15pm, then return to Auguston by 1pm.

#### Skate & Helmet Rentals

Parents are asked to pay for skate rental and/or helmet rental costs if needed. Students need to wear a helmet and can bring their own or rent one there for \$2.25. Due to this being a school event, helmets are required for all students on the ice. Skates can also be rented for \$3.35 a pair. Please indicate your child's shoe size.

#### Volunteers

We are asking for **2 Parent Volunteers per class**. Please make sure you have completed the annual <u>Volunteer Process</u> & have an approved Criminal Record Check. Volunteers will be contacted by their child's teacher.
