Kindness donut

Sledding rules

While the snow might just be behind us, now, we have had a few concerns about sledding before and after school. Students of all ages are using the 'grade 5 hill' beside the gym without helmets and going so fast that they end up sliding into the fence at the bottom. This hill is closed for before and after school sledding unless a parent is present with each child and again – the child must be wearing a helmet. We limit it to grade 5 students who are able to control their sleds a bit better and can react quicker than some of the younger kids. Sledding is still available to students of all ages on the hill just past our baseball diamond. Please remember to slide one at a time, clear the area at the bottom of the hill guickly and head to the edges of the hill or in line with one of the trees to make your way back up to the top. Students are reminded that there is no sharing sleds with friends (only if you are siblings), and helmets are strongly encouraged.



Student Learning Survey

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

The 2023 Student Learning Survey has already been completed by our grade 4 students here at Auguston Traditional. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey as well, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at <u>http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey</u>. Any computer with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link with or without an anonymous logon code by selecting the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the *Results* section.

The e-survey site will be open until April 29th.

Thank you to parents who have set up your schoolcash account and utilize this option. You will be receiving reminders and messages about new items being added to your child's 'cart' when field trips and other items arise. A suggestion is to purchase a **prepaid credit card** to make purchases if you are concerned about online shopping. The district site is a secure site which does not hold account information.

SchoolCashOnline limits the amount of cash/cheques handled in schools, reduces paperwork, and results in more focused instructional time in the classroom. The Abbotsford School District now uses SchoolCashOnline for all schools. With SchoolCashOnline, parents have the convenient and secure option of paying for school items using their credit card online, 24/7.
