Principal's Message

Welcome

Hello everyone, and welcome back to school. This first week has been a great week of making connections, finding old friends and getting to know some new ones. We are happy to see everyone smiling and excited to be back to school and look forward to a great year ahead. September is always a busy month. We spend the first week trying to wake up on time and figuring out our routines again, then get put into our classes for the year and get to start figuring each other out, and then we jump right into our Fall activities and events. We have a few coming up that are explained in more detail below. On top of that many out of school activities are starting up as well, making us all suddenly very busy, somewhat tired and really missing those lazy days of summer of not so long ago. On the flip side, though, we can all enjoy some cooler nights, the foggy mornings and the warm afternoons of Autumn as we ease our way into the changing colours of Fall.



Class placements

Thank you for bearing with us as we navigated our way through this first week back. It can be difficult to not have established routines and not know who our teachers and classmates might be right away, and we appreciate your patience and support as we waited for permission to be able to settle our classes. The benefit of this first week switching around is that students have been able to work in different groups and with different teachers to build more relationships in our building. It has also been great to see everyone welcoming our new students and bringing them into the mix of friend groups. We are now set to settle classes and our class lists will be posted on the front lobby windows and emailed out by 4pm this afternoon (September 8th). The great news is that we have been able to settle our school almost entirely in straight grade groupings – something that hasn't happened for a few years here at Auguston Traditional. With the exception of our K/1 split, all other grades have two to three classes made up entirely of just their grade. We currently have 2 Kindergarten classes, a K/1 split, 2 grade 1 classes, 3 grade 2 classes, 3 grade 3 classes, 2 grade 4 classes and 2 grade 5 classes. In addition to that, all of our classes are almost full with only 5 spaces available in our entire school! Wow!!!



When we sent out class request forms in the Spring, we received a record number back and as a staff we have poured over those lists very carefully. Please remember that though we do take them into consideration, friend group requests are the last requests considered and are only made if it works out with our planning. We look at placements for reasons such as teacher familiarity, balancing needs and strengths, keeping an equal mix of boys and girls, academic abilities and available supports spread out across all classes. We then look at which students we need to keep together or apart based on conflicts experienced in previous years, and finally consider friend requests as we can.

Our staff worked very hard to create balanced classes in a number of contexts and to meet as many of the class requests as possible. Sometimes that simply didn't work out. I know that you may be dealing with some tears this weekend as your children learn who is or isn't in their class. Please know that we have purposely thought through each placement to ensure that they have others in their classes that they can connect with, even if it isn't their very best friend from forever (last year) that they can't live without (but will see at recess and lunch each day), and every single class in our school is the absolute best class in our school (just don't tell the other kids because they'll want to be put into this class 😊). This is a hugely complex process made more difficult by the limited number of classes we had to place students in for each grade, but we feel that we have a great group of students placed where they need to be. Once the class lists are posted at 4pm, we trust that you will have lots of thoughtful conversations this weekend with your children about who is in their class, what they liked about their teacher during this week's rotations and what is exciting about the year moving forward.

Even though we had a number of tears last year as we went through this process, by the end of September students had all made connections with their classmates, found new friendships to develop, were able to still join their friends outside during break times and really loved their teachers and the class environments that they were in. Give it some time and know that we see this potential for all of the students in our classes.

By Monday we hope that everyone will be ready to jump in and make amazing memories for the year. Because either way, it's going to be a great one! Please reassure your children of that as you help them get comfortable with their class placements.



Expansion updates

Well, there aren't many. As noted in our welcome back newsletter, we are STILL waiting on permits to be approved. If you saw the presentation by MakeWORK projects at the PAC meeting in the Spring, you might remember that those permits were expected to be approved by June so they could start as soon as school was out. That hasn't happened and so, obviously, this puts us behind in our project schedule - but wow – are we not used to delays and disruptions in our world by now?!?!

Crews continue to work on what they can while waiting for those permits and we hope that they will be approved soon so that they can get to work building our amazing expansion.

Safety protocols

In the meantime, a large part of our initial start-up next week will be going over evacuation routes and safety protocols with our students. We are already working on safely moving in and out to the playground around our break times and ensuring that students use the crosswalk near our roundabout to cross. Please use these rules when moving around our school outside of school times as well so that students build those habits of safety around our project.

We also continue to ask for your help with traffic safety around our school. Walking your children to school is ideal if you are able to, but if you need to drive, please be mindful of our 30km/h School Zone that extends from just before the corner by our playing fields all the way past our school. Please also park only in marked spaces (Bylaw officers will be doing random spot checks at pickup and drop-off times) and watch for students and families at our two marked crosswalks along Stephen Leacock Drive.

Washrooms outside

Unfortunately, due to the construction project, access to our outside washrooms is blocked off for the duration of the year. Students are being reminded to go to the washroom before they go outside and also encouraged to try to make it until the end of recess if they can. However, students will be provided access to the first-floor washrooms as needed during outside play times.

Wasps

Tis the season for wasps outside! Living in the neighborhood, I'm sure you've seen them around as well, but we have one particular tree outside by our sand pit that the wasps are swarming around. We have also had a few wasp stings this first week back. When our maintenance crews came out to check on it for us, they told us that there are no nests, but the wasps like the sap in those particular trees and are feeding on the sap and thus swarming around the tree. As a precaution, we are roping the area around the base of the tree off from student use and are keeping an eye out for them during break times.

If your child has an allergy to bee/wasp stings, please let the office or their teacher know as soon as possible. If they require an EpiPen injection for potential reactions to stings, please make sure that they have an updated EpiPen with them at school. Staff and first aid personnel are trained to administer these doses and you will be contacted if they are stung while at school.

Student teachers

Coming soon – some more great teachers at our school! We are so excited to welcome SFU student teachers Ms. Barnett (with Mrs. Dhaliwal) and Ms. Turcotte (with Mrs. Preiss) to our team here at Auguston Traditional. They will be sharing classes, creating amazing unit plans, working with small groups and whole classes as they learn how to be amazing teachers. We look forward to welcoming them here to Auguston and know you will all make them feel welcome, too!

Cops for Cancer and Terry Fox Run

Our school is taking part in a couple of worthy fundraising events this month. Many of us have been affected by cancer or known someone who was. 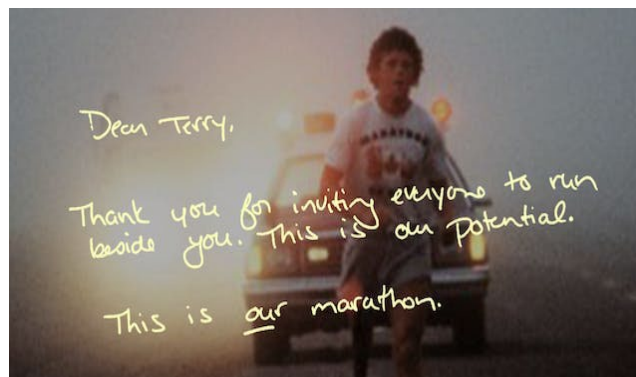

Back-to-school health

Your healthy back-to-school guide

As summer winds down, it's time to gear up for a healthy back-to-school season. Set the stage for a smooth transition back to school. Here are some practical tips to get you started.

Prioritize sleep

Ensuring your child gets enough sleep is an important part of a healthy back-to-school routine. Quality sleep helps with concentration, mood and overall well-being. In the weeks leading up to the start of school, gradually adjust your child's sleep schedule so they can adapt to the new routine. Aim for 9 to 11 hours of quality sleep per night.

Eat well

Support your child's learning and development with scheduled meals and snacks. Breakfast kick starts their morning, while snacks and lunches nourish them throughout the day. Pack a water bottle to help them stay hydrated.

Boost immunity

As with any public environment, school exposes children to various germs and viruses. Ensuring they are up-to-date on their vaccinations helps protect them and others. Specific immunizations

are recommended for children prior to entering Kindergarten as well as in grades six and nine. Help your child avoid the spread of illness by encouraging them to wash their hands regularly, teaching them to cover their coughs and sneezes and keeping them home when sick.

Keep active

Adding physical activity to your child's routine sets them up for success. Activities like walking or biking to school, playing sports, dancing, swimming or helping around the house are great ways for your child to stay active. Set limits on screen time and promote outdoor play as much as possible for overall well-being.

Make time for talking and connection

Going back to school can be a cause of anxiety or stress for children. Make it a point to encourage open communication and support your child to talk about their feelings and help them feel heard and understood. Integrate downtime into their routine where they can relax or focus on a special interest or hobby.

Dogs and other pets on school grounds

A reminder that dogs and other pets are not permitted on school grounds in accordance with school district policy. There are posted signs on school grounds. This is for safety and health reasons. Pets are allowed for things such as show and tell with prior approval from your child's classroom teacher or principal. We appreciate your cooperation with this policy.

Bicycles, Scooters, Skateboards, Heelies and Other Wheeled Items

A reminder that these "wheeled" modes of transportation should be walked on and off school grounds for safety reasons. This includes the front of school sidewalk. With many younger students and pre-school children walking or running about an unfortunate accident could occur. Students riding these wheeled "vehicles" should be wearing a helmet. Please speak to your children regarding this matter.

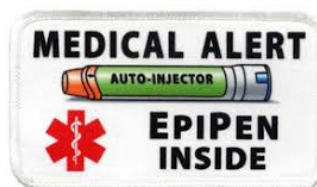
Bringing Electronic Equipment to School

Students at times bring various types of electronic devices to school (handheld gaming device). We would encourage you to ask your children to leave these devices at home. We don't want them to be damaged or misplaced as we cannot be responsible for their safekeeping at school. Thank you for cooperation.

Administration of Medication at School

If your child is required to take medication at school (i.e. asthma puffers, or prescription medicines) a "Permission to Administer Medication" form must be completed by your family doctor and returned to our office annually. Allergy Awareness



Many children come to school with life threatening allergies. This can vary from food allergies to certain foods like

nuts, fish, dairy etc., or it can be allergies associated with bee stings. Children with severe allergies require immediate medical attention should they come into contact with an allergen. Schools often have children with allergies to specific types of nuts such as peanuts and other nut products. For the safety of children, we are asking your cooperation in restricting the use of nut products in lunches or other food items brought to school. We understand that it is difficult at times to know what is in specific food products. For classrooms that have students with severe nut or other type of allergies we ask that parents refrain from sending items with these specific food products. It is understood that assuring that a school is absolutely "nut free" may be difficult and instead ask that our school community be "nut aware" so that we do not become complacent by thinking we are completely "nut free". We thank you for your understanding with this serious matter.

Lunches, Labels, and other Extras

Families are encouraged to ensure that students have all the materials required for the day of learning (ie. snack lunch, gym strip, jacket, homework, library book, etc.) upon their arrival to school. If you must bring a lunch to the school during the day, please bring it to the office and we will deliver it.

As well, ensure the lunch is clearly labeled with FIRST and LAST names, and your child's division. That helps us ensure your child receives their item in a timely manner. **School Supplies, jackets, hats, and sweaters should all be labeled clearly with your child's name as well.** Our Lost and Found overflows very quickly with articles left out on the playground. A name written inside these items allows us to find the owner.

Early Morning Arrivals to School

Please understand that adult supervision of students does not begin until 8:30 am. As the mornings become darker, we are not aware of students being in and around the school especially if they are on the playground. We understand that as parents work commitments often involve leaving early. If this is the case, we ask if it is possible for your children to go to friend's home and come to school closer to the time when supervision begins. We appreciate your cooperation with this matter. Safety of children is paramount. **After school, supervision is from 2:35 to 2:45pm.**

Please do not allow students to climb trees, the dug out or other "high up" places before or after school!

Early Pick Up

If you need to pick up your child due to illness or for an appointment, please enter it in Safe Arrival (and let your child's teacher know). Your child will need to be signed out.

Dropping off something for your child

In order to minimize class disruption and to adhere to safety protocols, **please do not take items directly to your child's classroom.**

Please drop them off at the office and they will be delivered to your child.

Daily Health Check

All parents, guardians, and/or caregivers are encouraged to conduct a **Daily Health Assessment of their child(ren)** each day before sending them to school.

If at all possible, please try to schedule appointments or activities for your child outside of school hours to help protect instructional time. If unavoidable, please notify the office beforehand **via Safe Arrival** and notify your child's teacher.

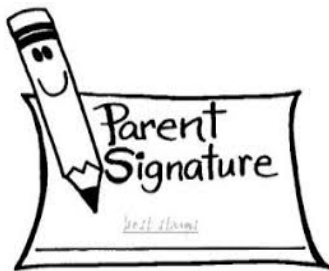

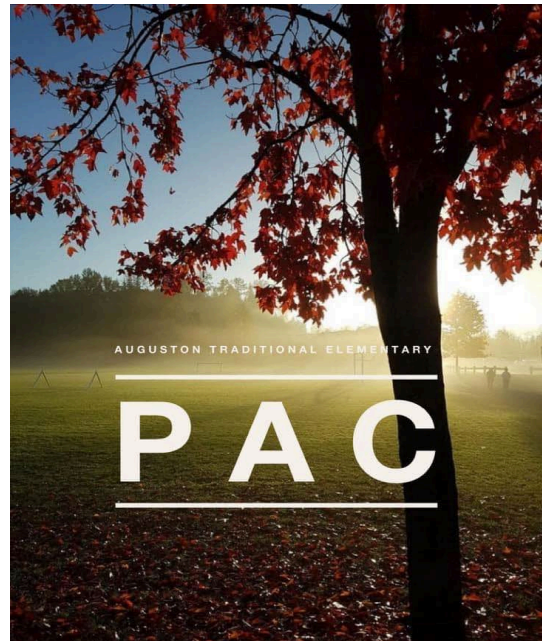

Pay for School Activities and Give Consent Online

Kindergarten parents, please watch for the cost of Kindergarten school supplies to be added in school cash soon!

Consent forms are ONLINE in SchoolCash. Consent includes Request for Email Address Consent, Google for Education, Photograph/Video and Media, Permission off Grounds and for Field Trips.

We would like to encourage ALL families at our school to utilize the online option for consent & payments EVERY time! We are currently at **89.4%** who have signed up. Let's make it 98, 99 or even 100% Auguston and **PLEASE USE the online option every time!**

Thank you to parents who have set up your schoolcash account and utilize this option. You will be receiving reminders and messages about new items being added to your child's 'cart' when field trips and other items arise. A suggestion is to purchase a **prepaid credit card** to make purchases if you are concerned about online shopping. The district site is a secure site which does not hold account information.

SchoolCashOnline limits the amount of cash/cheques handled in schools, reduces paperwork, and results in more focused instructional time in the classroom. The Abbotsford School District now uses SchoolCashOnline for all schools.
