Fundraising updates

Our online fundraisers collected funds for both the Terry Fox Foundation and for Cops for Cancer (and topped up by our 'no uni' funds) and we will also be donating \$700 from our 'no uni' funds to the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 15 (Abbotsford) in recognition of Remembrance

Day and the poppies that were given to each student and staff member this week.



And here at Auguston, we are looking to do even more.....with a new Auguston Traditional Christmas Mitten Project.



We are seeking financial donations for an upcoming school community project to support the <u>Cyrus Centre</u>. As a school we are going to create 100 warm winter mitten kits to support at risk youth and families.



We are reading the book Metis Christmas Mittens by Leah Marie Dorian and then our Kindergarten

and grade 1 students will colour pictures from the book, our grade 2 and 3 students will wrap and package up the mittens, and our grade 4 and 5 students will write messages on labels and safety pin heart beads to each pair of mittens. Our supplies have all been ordered and will be here soon – and we hope to pull the packages together in November for December delivery to Cyrus Centre (we purchased them a copy of the book, too!). If families would like to donate funds to support this cause they can donate in SchoolCash online starting Nov. 12. Any extra funds raised will be donated directly to the Cyrus Centre to support more of their programs.

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Helping Hands



We continue to work on using our 'helping hands' to solve conflict on the playground here at Auguston Traditional. Unfortunately, we have seen an increase in rough play, rude or disrespectful language, and hands on behaviours outside recently. We continue to highlight this valuable tool when we have a disagreement. We hold our hand open and work our way through the steps:

1 – Say 'stop, I don't like it when you _____, because ______'. It's everyone's responsibility to stop when they are asked to stop and we are working on that, too,

- 2 Ignore the behaviour,
- 3 Walk away from the situation,

4 – Find something else to do or someplace else
to be, and – if those first steps don't work 5 – Seek help from an adult on duty.

Not only does this strategy help our students to have a voice and advocate for their needs, but it also frees up our duty parents and teachers to deal with any bigger issues that may arise. We have 'helping hands' posters up in classrooms and around the school and will continue to work on this throughout the year. We are seeing progress and a lot of students are finding their voice in this – which is really great to see. We appreciate your support from home in this as well as we try to curb those hands on and disrespectful behaviours.

Recess will take place between 10:00 to 10:20am on Thursday, Nov. 7.




Rock your Mocs

Pay for School Activities and Give Consent Online



Consent forms are ONLINE in <u>SchoolCash</u>. Consent includes Request for Email Address Consent, Photograph/Video and Media, Permission off Grounds and for Field Trips.

Thank you to parents who have set up your schoolcash account and utilize this option. You will be receiving reminders and messages about new items being added to your child's 'cart' when field trips and other items arise. A suggestion is to purchase a **prepaid credit card** to make purchases if you are concerned about online shopping. The district site is a secure site which does not hold account information.

SchoolCashOnline limits the amount of cash/cheques handled in schools, reduces paperwork, and results in more focused instructional time in the classroom. The Abbotsford School District now uses SchoolCashOnline for all schools. With SchoolCashOnline, parents have the convenient and secure option of paying for school items using their credit card online, 24/7.
