Hello Auguston families – and welcome to Fall! It's a beautiful time of year up here on the mountain and we are ready to thoroughly enjoy some crisp, sunny Fall days ahead, and also some cozy, rainy ones, too.

We have had a great start to our year and it is wonderful to see everyone settled in to their classrooms and routines and working hard at their studies. I feel especially privileged to know so many of our families as I head into my third year here at Auguston. Seeing all of the familiar faces and knowing the stories that make us who we are allows us to strengthen the connections we've made and has helped to make it a smooth start this year. I am enjoying getting to know all of the new faces around our school and look forward to meeting you, too, if I haven't already.

To catch everyone up, here are a few interesting facts about our school this year:

We currently have 336 students in 15 classes

- We have 24 teachers overall a number of our classes have teachers that share teaching during the week, as well we have a few others who support us in the gym, library, LLC, etc.
- We also have 8 EAs to support student learning
- We have an extra cohort of itinerant teachers that support our students in other ways like Speech and Language, Indigenous teachings, English Language Learning and Counselling supports, as well as other District specialists assigned to our school
- Our St. John's Ambulance certified
 Therapy Dog Tess is back with us this year to read with students in the PAWS for Reading program
- We will be moving into our expansion space at some point this year – most likely around Spring Break. The new classrooms and spaces are coming together and it looks amazing!

We have some exciting things planned for the months ahead and are looking forward to a great Fall.

Traffic and Parking



Thank you to everyone for being kind and patient with each other out there as we navigate our busiest times of the day - drop off and pickup. In order to move everyone

through these busy times safely and efficiently,

ABBOTS FORD SCHOOL DISTRICT

we ask that everyone follow a few simple rules around our school:

1) We have 'no parking' zones along
Stephen Leacock Drive that run from just
before the fire hydrant above our parking
lot to our crosswalk and bus loop
entrance, and then again from just in
front of the school drop off area to just
past the school property line. These
areas are typically blocked off by cones,
but we ask that you respect those no
parking zones even if the cones aren't
out.

These areas of no parking are designated as they lead up to our crosswalks and it gives drivers clear sight lines that allow them enough time to stop safely as crossing. Student safety is a priority for us and we need your help to ensure that students are able to cross safely.

- 2) There is also a 'no stopping' rule in both of our bus loops. A number of people will say 'I'm not stopping' or that they are there 'just for a minute'. If you have to stop longer than the time it takes your child to get in or out of the vehicle, we ask that you do another loop to allow those behind you to get through.
- 3) The busses can slow us down as they take a bit longer to load or off-load, but they usually come a bit before or after the bell to avoid backing things up in our bus loops. Thank you for allowing them a bit of extra grace as they safely pickup or deliver our students.

We appreciate your continued support in this and your kindness in dealing with all of our community safety needs. Bylaw Officers will be doing regular visits and will hand out tickets to cars parked in the 'no parking' areas.

Dress for the Weather



With Fall comes cooler, wetter weather and we need to remember to dress appropriately. We go outside for our breaks in all kinds of weather, so unless it's really cold or heavy, heavy rain, students need to be ready with warm jackets, waterproof shoes or boots, and gloves, hats or umbrellas as needed. An extra change of clothes in their backpacks is a great idea and saves an extra trip to bring them dry clothes!

Digital devices

At Auguston Traditional we believe in promoting online safety and a focused learning environment. As part of the district's new AP 345 – Student Use of Personal Digital Devices in Schools, our Code of Conduct has been amended to read:

Students are expected to:

- Refrain from inappropriate computer usage and/or multi-media devices
- refrain from using personal digital devices during school hours unless given the expressed permission of the school administrator or their teacher

A personal digital device is any personal digital device that can be used to communicate or to access the internet, such as a cell phone, smart watch or tablet.

An updated Code of Conduct is currently under review and will be shared with our entire school community soon.

Christmas Concert

A Christmas Concert will be happening this year! We haven't worked out the logistics of what this event will look like yet, but we do have staging booked for our Christmas Concert for the week of December 16-20. Concert(s) will take place within the school day and will likely be broken up by grades due to maximum capacity regulations for fitting all of our guests into our gym. As a staff we feel that student safety is a top priority and part of that means students need to be prepared and know

what to do in the event of an emergency. Over the course of the year, we practice 6 Fire Drills, 2 Earthquake Drills and 2 Shelter in Place Drills. We post the dates of our drills on our PAC Facebook page as well as on our website and always give students and staff a heads up before the drill starts. Students and staff did a great job of evacuating our school in just over 7 minutes during our first Fire Drill of the year.

It's almost Hallowe'en and that means we have some fun and festive happenings planned around our school! On October 29th our youngest students will enjoy a pumpkin patch in our very own garden. The PAC has sponsored the event and every student in Kindergarten and

Soccer Gr. 5


This year students in Grade 5 will be able to participate on the Soccer team. Please provide consent in <u>schoolcash</u> if you would like your child to participate.
