We hope you love it here.



September is always a busy month. Sometimes we forget just how busy it can be, but we are all finding our way through new routines, people and spaces. This is

getting easier as we are now settled in our classrooms for the year and focusing on some great learning ahead. And so here we go!



We already have a few Fall activities coming our way that we need to let you know about in this newsletter. There is a lot of information here and we appreciate you reading through it all so that you are informed and up to date. We will also have a few extra emails coming your way as we set up permission forms, share information about volunteer opportunities, gather contact information and more. From the office, we try to put out one newsletter each month and then typically one reminder email every week or so with any imminent dates and activities. Expansion Project



We have seen so many improvements over the summer and our new extension looks amazing! We had a drainage system installed under our staff parking lot, had upgrades made to our interior lighting and announcement system, and of course so much progress has been made in the new addition including drywall in hallways and classrooms, siding on the outside, and flooring in some of the new classrooms already. This month they are installing our new elevator and continuing work both inside and outside the new part of the building. We still don't have a set completion date but are hoping to be gaining access to our new space sometime between Winter Break and Spring Break.

Traffic Safety



We are asking for your help with traffic safety around our school. Walking your children to school is ideal if you are able to, but if you need to drive, please

be mindful of our 30km/h School Zone that extends from just before the corner by our playing fields all the way past our school. Please also park only in marked spaces (Bylaw officers will be doing random spot checks at pickup and drop-off times) and watch for students and families at our two marked crosswalks along Stephen Leacock Drive. Together we can make safety our priority.

Medical updates



Some students at our school have severe or life-threatening allergies or medical concerns. We are a 'nut-free' school to avoid contact with these allergens of peanuts, tree nuts and coconuts. If your child as an allergy or medical condition

we need to know about, please advise us as soon as possible and provide us with any medications they may need in the event of an incident or reaction (a prescribed Epi-Pen or medications with instructions on administration in the event of an emergency). Dogs on our field and playground



We share our field space with our community as a large part of our field is Mather's Park. We usually talk with members of the public that we see out there when our students are

outside for breaks and ask that people try to walk or use the space when students are not present. This is to keep everyone safe and so that we don't cross paths with adults that we don't know.

We also ask that dogs are kept away from our students as everyone tries to run to meet and pet the dog, but, not knowing the animals, we don't want to cause stress or excite the dogs out on our play area as it makes it difficult to predict their reaction. Please leave pets at home when walking during school hours or when dropping off or picking up your child(ren).

A more recent concern has been the number of people who are bringing their dogs to our school but not cleaning up after them! You can imagine the worry, upset and mess on our shoes we are experiencing as students play on the field and accidentally step on or roll on it. Yuck! Please help us avoid this icky issue by cleaning up after pets, leaving them at home when coming to or around the school and sharing this info with neighbours who may not have children who go to our school. Thank you!

Behaviour expectations

This week our whole school spent an afternoon in multi-age groups travelling to different parts inside and outside of our school learning all about expectations for behaviour in each area.

Students were able to learn about safety rules and expectations specific to our school and playground equipment. This will allow us all to start the year off right and be on the same page about how and where we can play, learn and grow safely together throughout the year.

Cops for Cancer and Terry Fox Run

Our school is taking part in a couple of worthy fundraising events this month. Many of us have been affected by cancer or know someone who was. We are going to be raising funds for cancer research through two events:

Afterschool programs

We are so excited to be able to provide some after school opportunities for our students again this year. Each term, the Abby Community School Society will be running extracurricular sports, art, drama, and active learning programs.

New to us this year is our DOVE Girls program for grade 4 and 5 students. These programs will have limited spaces and will fill up fast! The cost will be \$65-\$85 for each program that will see students staying afterschool from 2:35-4:00pm one day a week for six weeks of each session. Our fall programs start in late October and will see our K/1 students doing Outdoor Explorers, our grade 2/3 students learning about Science and our grade 4/5 students participating in either Basketball or DOVE Girls workshops.

Your healthy back-toschool guide

As summer winds down, it's time to gear up for a healthy back-to-school season. Set the stage for a smooth transition back to school. Here are some practical tips to get you started.

Prioritize sleep

Ensuring your child gets enough sleep is an important part of a healthy back-to-school routine. Quality sleep helps with concentration, mood and overall well-being. In the weeks leading up to the start of school, gradually adjust your child's sleep schedule so they can adapt to the new routine. Aim for nine to 11 hours of quality sleep per night.

Eat well

Support your child's learning and development with scheduled meals and snacks. Breakfast kick starts their morning, while snacks and lunches nourish them throughout the day. Pack a water bottle to help them stay hydrated.

Boost immunity

As with any public environment, school exposes children to various germs. Ensuring they are upto-date on their vaccinations helps protect them and others. Specific immunizations are

recommended for children prior to entering kindergarten as well as in grades six and nine. Help your child avoid the spread of illness by encouraging them to wash their hands regularly, teaching them to cover their coughs and sneezes and keeping them home when sick.

Keep active

Adding physical activity to your child's routine sets them up for success. Activities like walking or biking to school, playing sports, dancing, swimming or helping around the house are great ways for your child to stay active. Set limits on screen time and promote outdoor play as much as possible for overall well-being.

Make time for talking and connection

Going back to school can be a cause of anxiety or stress for children. Make it a point to encourage open communication and support your child to talk about their feelings and help them feel heard and understood. Integrate downtime into their routine where they can relax or focus on a special interest or hobby.

Bringing Electronic Equipment to School

Students at times bring various types of electronic devices to school (handheld gaming device). We would encourage you to ask your children to leave these devices at home. We don't want them to be damaged or misplaced as we cannot be responsible for their safekeeping at school. Thank you for cooperation.

Lunches, Labels, and other Extras

Families are encouraged to ensure that students have all the materials required for the day of learning (ie. snack lunch, gym strip, jacket, homework, library book, etc.) upon their arrival to school. If you must bring a lunch to the school during the day, please bring it to the office and we will deliver it.

As well, ensure the lunch is clearly labeled with FIRST and LAST names, and your child's division. That helps us ensure your child receives their item in a timely manner. School Supplies, jackets, hats, and sweaters should all be labeled clearly with your child's name as well. Our Lost and Found overflows very quickly with articles left out on the playground. A name written inside these items allows us to find the owner.

SafeArrival - Report student absences online

The Abbotsford School District utilizes an automated student attendance management system called SafeArrival, offered through SchoolMessenger®, the company that hosts our parent notification system.

With SafeArrival, you can report your child's absence in advance using any of these 3 convenient methods:

SchoolMessenger App

Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the <u>Apple App</u> <u>Store</u> or the <u>Google Play Store</u>.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

<u>Note</u>: Absences of more than 5 days should be reported to <u>auguston@abbyschools.ca</u> or Ph: 604- 557-0422 (5 consecutive days maximum for reporting on School Arrival).

Early Morning Arrivals to School

Please understand that adult supervision of students does not begin until 8:30 am. As the mornings become darker, we are not aware of students being in and around the school especially if they are on the playground. We understand that as parents work commitments often involve leaving early. If this is the case, we

ask if it is possible for your children to go to friend's home and come to school closer to the time when supervision begins. We appreciate your cooperation with this matter. Safety of children is paramount. After school, supervision is from 2:35 to 2:45pm.

Please do not allow students to climb trees, the dug out or other "high up" places before or after school!

Early Pick Up

If you need to pick up your child due to illness or for an appointment, please enter it in Safe Arrival (and let your child's teacher know). Your child will need to be signed out.

Dropping off something for your child

In order to minimize class disruption and to adhere to safety protocols, <u>please do not take</u> <u>items directly to your child's classroom.</u>

Please drop them off at the office and they will be delivered to your child.

Daily Health Check

All parents, guardians, and/or caregivers are encouraged to conduct a Daily Health Assessment of their child(ren) each day before sending them to school.

Appointments

If at all possible, please try to schedule appointments or activities for your child outside of school hours to help protect instructional time. If unavoidable, please notify the office beforehand via Safe Arrival and notify your child's teacher.



Consent forms are ONLINE in SchoolCash. Consent includes Request for Email Address Consent, Google for Education, Photograph/Video and Media, Permission off Grounds and for Field Trips.

We would like to encourage <u>ALL families</u> at our school to utilize the online option for consent & payments <u>EVERY</u> time! We are currently at <u>89.4</u>% who have signed up. Let's make it 98, 99 or even 100% Auguston and <u>PLEASE USE the online option every time</u>!

Thank you to parents who have set up your schoolcash account and utilize this option. You will be receiving reminders and messages about new items being added to your child's 'cart' when field trips and other items arise. A suggestion is to purchase a **prepaid credit card** to make purchases if you are concerned about online shopping. The district site is a secure site which does not hold account information.

SchoolCashOnline limits the amount of cash/cheques handled in schools, reduces paperwork, and results in more focused instructional time in the classroom. The Abbotsford School District now uses SchoolCashOnline for all schools. With SchoolCashOnline, parents have the convenient and secure option of paying for school items using their credit card online, 24/7.
