Kindergarten registration for the 2025-26 school year will commence on Monday, January 20, 2025, at 8:30 am.

- Registration will not be COMPLETE until all necessary forms and documentation are received.

Afterschool Programs



MDI and Student Learning Surveys coming up

In January and February, some students at our school will be completing these important surveys.

Students in Grade 4 will have the chance in class to fill out our Student Learning Survey over the coming months. Completed by schools across BC, the Student Learning Survey provides the Ministry of Education and Child Care with valuable information on student satisfaction with their school experiences.

Grade 5 students will be completing the Middle Years Development Instrument survey between January 14 and March 14. This is a self-report questionnaire that asks students about their thoughts, feelings and experiences around school and is done in collaboration with the Human Early Learning Partnership through UBC. Expansion Project

We are almost ready to move in! The district is doing some final finishing in our new learning spaces and our new desks and furniture are coming soon. We are very excited to make the move and get learning in our new and beautiful classrooms!

Phase two of the project will see two of our former rooms renovated into a daycare space with areas for 0-5 care. At this point we do not

yet know who will be running the daycare, or even a potential opening date, so we are not yet ready to start a waitlist for daycare spots. We will keep you updated as we know more.

Food Drive

Many thanks to everyone in our Auguston Traditional community for your donations of non-perishable food items during December. We were able to fill 6 ½ bins of food for the Salvation Army this year to help those in need in our community.

Mitten Project

In addition – we also raised funds that covered the entire cost of our Mitten Project – and then some! Just before the winter break, Mrs.

Simpson and Mrs. Sward visited the staff at Cyrus Centre where we were able to donate 100 pairs of warm winter mittens that students had packaged up and pinned heart beads and messages onto, as well as a copy of the book Metis Christmas Mitten by Leah Marie Dorion and a cheque for \$500. Thank you to everyone who donated funds towards this amazing project which allowed us to show caring and kindness to those in need at Christmas.



Sickness



The break and some great rest and relaxation was just what our bodies needed to beat the sick bugs floating around, but unfortunately many are still hanging on. Please remember that if your child has a fever or is showing symptoms of sickness, the best place for them to get the rest they need is at home. We are doing what we can to prevent the spread of sickness here at school, including lots of hand washing and keeping our spaces clean. Dress for the weather



With our cold weather coming, please ensure that your children have warm weather gear, rain proof jackets and waterproof boots as we will be heading outside as much as possible

at recess and lunch times. Those fresh air breaks do wonders for our growing brains – keeping them clear and ready for learning - so we will continue to go outside every day unless it is really heavy rain or extremely cold. A change of clothes is also helpful to have here at the school and will avoid us calling for some dry clothes to be dropped off on those rainy, wet days.

Inclement weather guidelines



As we head into our snowy and icy season, please be aware of the inclement weather guidelines found on our website: Winter
Weather Procedures. If schools are closed, emails (and text messages if you have signed up for them) are sent out by the School District office. School closure information will also be posted on our website, on social media and broadcasted by local radio stations. If you wake up to snow, please check there first to see if a snow day has been called.

Sledding rules



Just a reminder of our sledding guidelines – the kids have reviewed

these as well. We want to ensure that the students are having fun out there but of course safety is our number one priority. Our rules around sledding on school grounds are as follows:

- Our grade 5 sledding hill beside the gym is permanently closed due to the construction project and our storage bin being at the bottom. There is also no sledding on the hill above the school near the garden area. These closures are in place during school hours and within the duty times before and after school.
- Helmets are preferred for all sledders.

- The grade 4/5 area is on the hill closest to the baseball dugout, with grades 2 and 3 between the trees and K/1s farthest from the school on the smallest, shortest slope.
- Only students with sleds are allowed on the hills. As some families will choose not to send their kids with sleds for safety reasons, sharing of sleds is not allowed unless it is between siblings.
- Students are to sled down alone (no doubling up) and one sled at a time, giving the previous sledder time to move away from the bottom of the hill before going.
- Students at the bottom are to move to the side of the hill or in line with the trees to make their way back up.
- No standing at the bottom of the hill unless you are out of the slide zone.
- It can get icy and slippery out there, so caution while around the sledding areas is important!
- No skis or snowboards please, just sleds.
- If conditions become too icy, sledding will be closed. This closure will be decided on depending on conditions on a daily basis.

Also:

- Students are asked not to eat the snow in and around the school pavement areas as we use rock salt and chemical product to reduce the ice and make our surfaces less slippery.
- We have a no throwing snow rule not at each other, not at trees or buildings, not up in the air - as there may be rocks and ice chunks mixed in.



Dogs on school grounds

Recently we have had a number of dog messes to clean up on our field again. Though we are good neighbours and are happy to share our space, our students safety and cleanliness is our first priority. If you bring your dogs to the school field for a run, please do so when students are not present on the field or playground. This is for safety reasons as we don't know every dog and if they are safe around large groups of noisy kids. We also ask that you don't allow our students to pet or come near your dog and that you clean up after your dogs, too, if they do their business on the field – that is not fun to step in!! Please also share this information with your friends and neighbors who may not have students who attend our school but who also want to use our field.


No Parking Zones



Please continue to be mindful of our no parking zones out front of the school along Stephen Leacock Drive. Things can get really busy around our school during our drop off and pickup times,

and we appreciate you keeping all of our families safe out there. Please remember to GO SLOW and be aware of our students as they are moving around our school property and crossing the road. If you are dropping off or picking up in one of our bus loops, please be mindful of everyone's

time and DO NOT PARK in either loop. You must remain in your vehicle in order to keep traffic moving and get everyone safely on their way. If your child(ren) aren't there ready when you pass through the bus loop – please do another loop so that the traffic behind you can move through. The 'no parking zones' are coned off and we appreciate you keeping sight lines in mind as you approach our crosswalks. Thank you!
