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Principal's Message

Welcome to May and to our beautiful sunshine that's been joining us lately. It sure does feel like Spring out there!



Our most exciting update to share this month is that our new Gaga Ball Courts are now open! We are learning the rules and having so much fun playing with friends at recess and lunch times. It's a busy, fast-paced and fun game that keeps students moving – and we are loving it! We are also excited to get some new Foursquare courts and Hopscotch runs painted on our blacktop very soon – after two long years we've almost got our entire play area back!

As the weather gets increasingly better over the coming weeks, please don't forget to send your kids to school with hats, sunglasses, sunscreen on and water bottles at the ready to keep them hydrated! We will be heading outside a lot to learn and play so it's important to have those basics covered. Though crocks and sandals are comfy shoes in the warm weather, we appreciate students wearing runners to keep their feet and toes safe, particularly when outside running around on our woodchips, gravel and blacktop.

We also need to remind our families that Abbotsford schools are closed campuses and we appreciate that visitors aren't outside during break times mingling with students. We don't always know who is connected to who, and to keep our students safe we ask that you enjoy the track or walk your dog separate from our recess and lunch outside times (10:40-11am and 12:35-1:05pm). Classes are also often outside on the playground or field areas, and we ask that you don't call students over if you are out there at the same time. Thank you for helping us keep all of our students safe.




Nominations will be voted on at the May General Meeting, and the elected individuals will serve as part of next year's Executive Team.

Thank you to parents who have set up your schoolcash account and utilize this option. You will be receiving reminders and messages about new items being added to your child's 'cart' when field trips and other items arise. A suggestion is to purchase a **prepaid credit card** to make purchases if you are concerned about online shopping. The district site is a secure site which does not hold account information.

SchoolCashOnline limits the amount of cash/cheques handled in schools, reduces paperwork, and results in more focused instructional time in the classroom. The Abbotsford School District now uses SchoolCashOnline for all schools. With SchoolCashOnline, parents have the convenient and secure option of paying for school items using their credit card online, 24/7.
